TOPIC: "What can the world learn today from Mahatma Gandhi?"

Section I - General Rules

ICA will have the right to edit, publish or otherwise duplicate any essay entered into the contest without payment to the author. Only the winners will be contacted with the results.

Section II - Qualifications for Contestants

The contest is open to all students in grades 9-12 in public, private and home schools within Howard County, Maryland.

Section III - Timeline

Entries must be emailed to contact@icahoward.org with "Essay Contest" written in the subject line by: April 30, 2019, 11:59PM EST PREVIOUS SUBMISSIONS CAN BE REVISED AND RESUBMITTED. ONLY THE LAST ENTRY WILL BE CONSIDERED.

Section III - Contest Rules

- 1. Participants must write on the official topic.
- 2. Essay must be written in English.
- 3. Contestants may submit only one essay entry.
- 4. Each entry must include a Cover Page with the Title of the Contest, name, grade, address and school attending on it.
- 5. Essays must be typewritten, double-spaced with the contestant's name, grade, address and school attending in the header.
- 6. Each page must be numbered.
- 7. Essay must be a minimum of 300 words but no more than 500 words. The title, bibliography or footnotes are not counted in the word limit.
- 8. Essays will be judged on material organization, vocabulary and style, grammar, punctuation, spelling, neatness, and adherence to contest rules.
- 9. The decision of the ICA Board will be final.
